Pastor's Corner

The founding of Boy Scouts, Presidents Washington and Lincoln, Thomas Edison, St. Valentine, and the infamous groundhog – they all get our attention during the month of February because they each have a day marked on the calendar.

Much of our life is marked by a calendar, of some sort. We like to buy calendars. Who would have thought that there would be stores that would only sell calendars? For some of us, calendars have replaced the diaries of old ... they not only remind us what we're going to do but they can remind us what we've done.

The Church has a calendar too. It is called the liturgical year. It is basically divided into two equal parts ... the first part, starting with Advent,

helps us celebrate the life of Christ and the second part, starting with the Sunday of Pentecost, helps us celebrate the ministry of the Church. The second part is called “Pentecost” ... it basically lasts from the early summer into the fall.

The first part is known by many names. Advent reminds us of the promises that Jesus would come and of the promise that Jesus is coming again ... Christmas celebrates his birth for twelve days ... Epiphany announces that those who are truly wise recognize Jesus ... Lent takes us on a journey to Holy Week which brings us finally to the Three Days (“Triduum”) including the meal on Maundy Thursday, the cross on Good Friday, and the si-

lence of Holy Saturday ... and then the silence is shattered as the trumpets of Easter announce that Christ is Risen ... and then comes the Holy Spirit which gives birth to the Church ... and then we are into Pentecost again. And so it goes ... over and over again ... until we are forever with Him in Heaven!

The Church Year is not an object of worship but an aide to help us worship. Its purpose is to help us remember the significant events and persons in the story of our salvation.

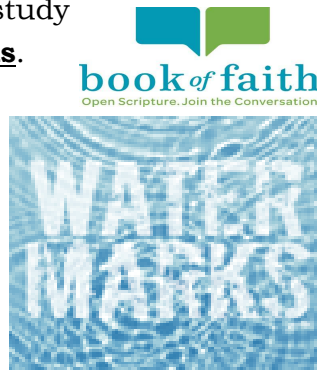

Review and accept 2011 year-end reports

Mike Panico moved to accept the 2011 year-end reports. The motion passed.

New Business

Election counters

Nancy DeVito, Shirley Lyles, and Bill Walleck were appointed as counters for the election.

Election of call committee

Voters were asked to choose 6 from a slate of 12 candidates.

2012 budgets

Carl Bornholt explained details for general, building, and youth funds. Eric Noelke moved to accept the 2012 budget. The motion passed.

Diane Kurtz explained details for the Master's Christian Preschool budget. Lee Edmunds moved to approve the preschool budget for 2012. The motion passed.

Metro-Chicago Synod Assembly representatives

Eric Noelke moved that Carol Connor and Angie Stone be appointed to represent LCM at the Metropolitan Chicago Synod assembly. The motion passed.

C11:01:01e: “The Treasurer chairs the Finance Committee” and
C13.06.07: “There shall be a Finance Committee chaired by the Treasurer.”
Jim Flanigan moved to table the proposed changes. The motion passed.

C12.02.04: “Candidates for election ... shall be asked to provide biographical information which may be posted ... on the church website.” Merridee Panico moved that the change be accepted. The motion passed.

C12.04d.01: “Representatives of the congregation council will meet semi-annually with each staff member to review performance” and
C12.04d.02: “Representatives of the congregation council will present results of the annual salary reviews ...” and
C12.04d.03: “The congregation council will arbitrate disputes between staff members” and
C13.04.03: “A Mutual Ministry Committee may be formed ... to meet periodically with the rostered persons.”
Dan Hoehn moved that all four proposed changes be tabled. The motion passed.

C12:05.01: “Individual giving records shall be available to the Pastor and Stewardship Committee Chair. The Pastor and Stewardship Committee chair shall jointly decide to share this information when appropriate.” Kevin Howard moved to accept the proposed change. The motion passed.

C12.07: “The congregation council shall review, each February, the membership roster ... Members who have been inactive during the previous calendar year will be notified in writing within 30 days that they will be removed as members of this congregation.” Pastor Curt moved to approve the change. The motion passed.

C12.09.03. “The agenda for the annual congregation meeting, the budget, and all reports ... shall be posted on the church website.” Jim Flanigan moved to accept the change. The motion was defeated.

C13: 06.01: “Committee members shall serve for a maximum of six years and shall not be eligible to rejoin that committee for two years.” Pastor Curt Gerald moved to accept the change. The motion was defeated.

Biblical Storytellers present *The Gospel of Mark*

Before the stories of the Bible were composed as written literature, they were told around campfires, dinner tables, and banquet halls as ancient entertainment. On **-Sunday, February 19 at 4:00 PM,** a team of Biblical storytellers from the Chicago area Prairie Wind Guild: Tellers of Sacred Stories will present *The Gospel of Mark* at Heritage Presbyterian Church, 965 N Kuhn Road, Carol Stream, as a gift to the community.

The ancient art of oral storytelling has experienced a revival in the last decades, with storytelling festivals of many kinds drawing thousands of tellers and listeners across the country every summer. The *Gospel of Mark* presentation will be in the Biblical storytelling genre of telling the actual, unedited text of the Scripture. As the shortest and most action-packed of the Bible's four gospels (books about Jesus' life and ministry), *Mark* takes about as long as a movie or play.

Prairie Wind Guild is associated with the Network of Biblical Storytellers International, which defines the art as "a spiritual discipline...that binds tellers and listeners together in community." Prairie Wind Guild coordinator Rev. Beth Galbreath says, "Unlike drama with its usual fourth wall, telling is truly a shared experience. The audience can expect to *experience* Scripture, in this case Mark's story of Jesus, coming to life through the telling."

Admission is free, though donations to defray expenses will be gratefully accepted.

From the DuPage County Treasurer’s Office — Seniors Invited to Defer Property Taxes

Qualified senior citizens aged 65 years and older are invited to apply for the Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Program offered through the DuPage County Treasurer’s office by the State of Illinois. This program allows qualified senior citizens to defer property tax payments until which time the property is sold. In other words, once you qualify each year for the program, you don’t pay your real estate taxes until you sell the property or no longer own it. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues 6 percent simple interest until paid. To qualify, the senior citizen’s household income cannot exceed \$50,000. Additionally, the property must be used exclusively for residential purposes.
