Pastor's Corner

*John 1 – “¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome^[u] it. ... ¹⁴ **The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.***

In a recent article, Jim Wallis wrote “That is the meaning of the incarnation. That is the reason for the season. **In Jesus Christ, God hits the street.**” ¹

The ELCA website’s “faith in action” series includes a story about “Come2go ministries” which “began in 2003 by transforming an inner city warehouse in Fort Wayne, Ind., into a musical, coffeehouse atmosphere. One come2go member, Brad Etter,

said the goal is to reach those 'who otherwise wouldn't want to pull open heavy church doors.'

The Rev. Mark Minnick said the ministry's name implies action: 'The 'go' in come2go ministries is about responding to one's personal faith by going out to serve others.' 'It is wonderful seeing people become active in ministry as a response to their faith,' Minnick explained.

Etter is one who responded to the call. He was baptized at come2go and has been a member for almost five years. Etter, a surgical trauma unit computer technician, said, 'The congregation was there for me when my parents died.' 'Now I have a relationship with Christ and other congregation members,' Etter added. 'I have more of a purpose.'

Members form "Go Teams" that visit nursing homes, the local juvenile center, and local taverns to share hope. Come2go also sponsors an urban youth outreach center.

Sunday worship is complemented with weekly concerts by local and national acts. Concerts are recorded, edited, and aired on local television. Many have praised come2go ministries as the best small performance venue in northern Indiana."²

The Incarnation. God "hitting the streets." A church forming "Go Teams." I think we'll talk about those ideas during the Season of Epiphany (January 6 through the Sunday before Ash Wednesday in February.)

¹ Jim Wallis was raised in an evangelical family in the Midwest. As a teenager, his questioning of the racial segregation in his church and community led him to the black churches and neighborhoods of inner-city Detroit. He spent his student years involved in the civil rights and antiwar movements. While at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in Illinois, Jim and several other students started a small magazine and community with a Christian commitment to social justice which has now grown into a national faith-based organization. In 1979, *Time* magazine named Jim Wallis one of the "50 Faces for America's Future."

His latest book is *Rediscovering Values: On Wall Street, Main Street, and Your Street -- A Moral Compass for the New Economy*. His two previous books, *The Great Awakening: Reviving Faith & Politics in a Post-Religious Right America* and *God's Politics: Why the Right Gets It Wrong and the Left Doesn't Get It* were both *New York Times* bestsellers.

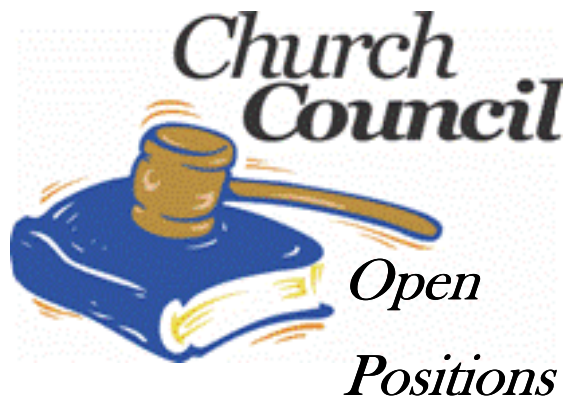

Thinking of serving on council? If you have wondered who does what, check out the descriptions below. According to our constitution, voting members* may submit their own names or another person's name to the Nominating Committee as possible candidates for Congregational Council. Now's the time to consider the following positions for 2012:

Executive Team:

- President (1 year term)-**OPEN**
- Vice President (1 year term)
- Treasurer (1 year term)
- Council Secretary (1 year term)-**OPEN**

Council Member At Large:

- Council 1 (continuing with 2nd year)
- Council 2 (2 year term)-OPEN
- Council 3 (continuing with 2nd year)
- Council 4 (2 year term)-OPEN

(***Voting** members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members shall have communed and made a contribution of record during the current or preceding year.)

What does the job require?

Council Positions from our Constitution:

- C11.01.01a The **president** shall preside at meetings of the congregation and the Congregation Council. In the event of the president's inability to serve, the vice-president shall preside.
- C11.01.01b The **vice-president** shall, in the absence of the president, assume the duties of the president.
- C11.01.01c The **secretary** shall keep accurate minutes of all meetings of the congregation and of the Congregation Council in a volume provided by the congregation, which said volume shall be preserved permanently in the congregational archives.
- C11.01.01d Minutes of the Congregation Council meetings shall be made available to the congregation on the Sunday after each meeting.
- C11.01.01e The **treasurer** oversees the Recording Treasurer who

shall keep the books of account of the congregation and shall receive from the financial secretary all funds and disburse them on proper orders, making monthly remittance of benevolence receipts to the treasurer of the synod. An audit is to be done for the previous year prior to the current year's annual meeting of each year.

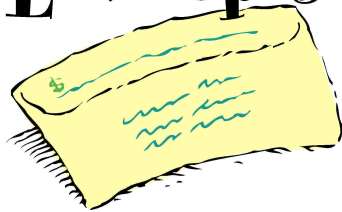

Treasurer's Office —
**Seniors Invited to Defer
Property Taxes**

Qualified senior citizens aged 65 years and older are invited to apply for the Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Program offered through the DuPage County Treasurer's office by the State of Illinois. This program allows qualified senior citizens to defer property tax payments until which time the property is sold. In other words, once you qualify each year for the program, you don't pay your real estate taxes until you sell the property or no longer own it. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues 6 percent simple interest until paid. To qualify, the senior citizen's household income cannot exceed \$50,000. Additionally, the property must be used exclusively for residential purposes.
