The fact that I am currently being referred to as a part time pastor in this congregation should not hide the fact that I am still a part time **INTERIM PASTOR**. The word “interim” means that I am serving this congregation for an indefinite period between the resignation of a previous pastor and the installation of the next pastor. And actually, in this case, it is not an indefinite period ... it is actually a defined period ... because it will not extend beyond March 29, 2013. So there is a countdown going on ... and right now that means that my hope is that within the next 19 months a new pastor will be called and installed as the pastor of this congregation.

You have heard a lot about that during the recent ***Life after Debt*** campaign. In my weekly meditation sent out by email on May 9 I wrote: “What we’re doing in this ***Whole Life Discipleship Campaign*** is ***building up the Body of Christ by getting ready to call a new pastor for*** Lutheran Church of the Master!

Right now I’m still not sure what “Life after Debt: Serving Today ... Creating Tomorrow” is going to mean for me. I do know that the greatest change it will bring me is ***that I won’t be driving to Carol Stream anymore! Eileen and I will be transferring to another congregation so that I will not in any way interfere with the new pastor as (s)he begins her/his ministry here which is always the role of the former pastor (s.)***

As you and I are faithful in continuing our ***regular giving*** and as God opens our hearts ***through prayer*** and our eyes to what we might consider as ***sacrificial giving beginning in July***, I am confident that new life will emerge within and through this congregation beginning with, but not limited to, the calling of our

new pastor because there is ***Life After Debt!***”

There are several ways in which we are going to continue the process of getting ready for the next pastor to arrive.

During the past month, Carol and Al and I have been meeting every Wednesday morning reading through our current constitution and comparing it with the ELCA’s model constitution for congregations. At the annual meeting in January, 2012, we intend to bring to the congregation two separate actions: (1) a motion to approve an updated constitution bringing our congregation’s constitution into conformity with the ELCA’s model constitution (more on that later); and (2) a motion of recommendations for amendments to our constitution, bylaw additions or changes, and continuing resolutions (more on that later too.) (One of our suggestions is that we will amend the constitution so that a quorum for a congregational meeting be based on a definite number of voting members rather than on a percentage of voting members. The purpose for this recommendation is to help facilitate congregational meetings.)

When we have accomplished that task of constitutional review, the constitution will be updated through the 2011 model constitution. Though the congregation and the new pastor should review the constitution on an annual basis, they won't have to be concerned about conformity to the model constitution for a couple of years.

In October, Merridee is making arrangements for pictures to be taken for the next congregational pictorial directory. I hope you are already setting aside the dates (see information on other pages in this issue of the newsletter.) (If you want to help with this process, talk with Merridee.) Please remember that this is not just about you. In case you are thinking about not having your picture taken, let me tell you how often I go to the most recent picture directory when I ask the staff "who was that person closest to the south wall in the 4th row?" When they give me a name I'll go to the directory to find his/her picture ... and 4 out of 5 times that person's picture is not in the directory. Members of the congregation can get by with calling me "pastor" ... but I can't just call you "member." The next pastor will want to know who you are ... and nothing is more helpful than an up

to date pictorial directory. There is and will be no obligation for anyone to buy pictures ... (but a lot of you might want to for your Christmas cards this year) ... so please ... **CALLING ALL MEMBERS** ... help us prepare for the new pastor by signing up to have your picture taken for the new congregational directory.

I was just talking with Tom about the next stewardship campaign for regular giving and the building fund. "*But we just did a stewardship drive,*" you might say. "**Yes we did,**" I could reply, "**but that one was for sacrificial giving over and above our regular giving to the operating fund and to the building fund.**" The next pastor's salary will not be paid from the **Life after Debt** monies ... that is all going to pay off the principal of our mortgage with **Thrivent Financial for Lutherans** and to reimburse the congregation for the costs associated with the recent campaign.

The next pastor's salary will come from my current salary and Pat's current salary in the operating funds of the congregation. And members of the congregation have not been asked to make their pledges for the operating funds and for the building fund for quite a while ... so

now we need to tend to that in order to be ready to call the next pastor. Now we will be asking you to indicate what your “over and above sacrificial giving” is over and above!

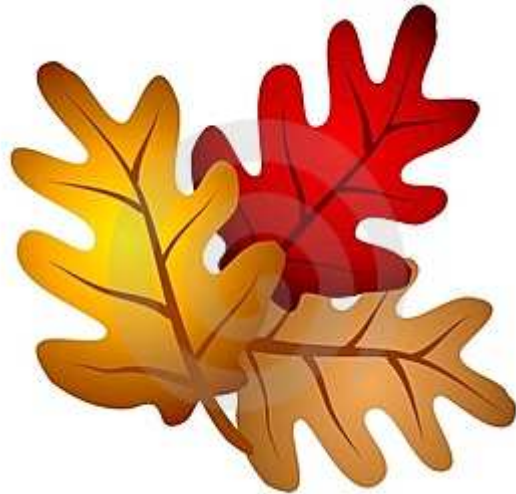
After I arrived two and a half years ago, we discovered that the congregation had not filed its articles of incorporation (which includes the preschool.) That was done immediately, and as long as the annual renewal documents and payment are sent to Springfield, that very important legal piece should be OK. The next pastor won't have to worry about that.

The membership roster itself has been a difficult thing. After several different mailings and processes specifically designed to work on that, I think we are close to having an accurate up to date membership listing which will be printed in the upcoming pictorial directory for which we are taking pictures (yours included) in October.

So ... for the next 19 months you are going to hear these words quite frequently from me. It is not that I don't like being here and it is not that I don't like what I'm doing here, but ***as your Interim***

***Pastor my job is to help this congregation prepare for its next pastor!
And that is what you and I are going to be doing!***

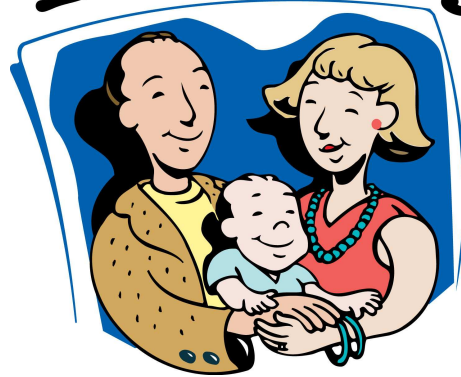


"Lit-n-Lattes" book club
