# Pastor's Corner

In February 1996, I attended a worship and teaching conference for Pastors in Atlanta which was hosted by **Promise Keepers**. More than 39,000 Christian clergy attended this conference under the theme "**Fan into Flame**." The poster from this conference hangs in the church office you have provided for me ... it has been in every office I have been privileged to use since 1996. This conference was reported to be the largest gathering of Christian clergy in modern history.

The conference and the poster are based on 2 Timothy 1:6 – "**For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands.**" That text from 2 Timothy reminds me of a verse from one of my favorite Old Testament prophets, Isaiah, in chapter 54:16 - "**See, it is I who created the blacksmith who fans the coals into**

**flame and forges a weapon fit for its work.”**

Having completed two years of ministry with you here at the Lutheran Church of the Master, I have been thinking about how this text relates to our congregation’s ministry (and I say “our” because, as most of you know, Eileen and I will be members of this congregation until the next pastor is called and begins his/her ministry by but not later than March 29, 2013 J.)

As we get ready to come together in annual meeting on January 30, 2011, I

suggest that **this congregation is like a camp fire with glowing embers that is waiting, through the Breath of God, to be fanned into flame.**

A couple months ago I decided to do a review of this congregation’s giving over the past seven years. I only included members who are still listed as members (if a person has died or transferred, their giving during this period is not included.) I was delighted to see that in those seven years, only two “giving units” are shown as giving \$0. That was much better than I had expected!

Can you imagine the total impact a little growth in stewardship by our members in each of these categories? To refer to this congregation as a sleeping giant is probably an understatement!

The more I looked at this report, the more it became apparent to me that this is showing me a congregation of glowing embers that could be reignited through the grace of God and the working of the Holy Spirit within us. True, some of these 296 giving units may have left us ... but as of this moment, they have not yet taken the common courtesy of letting us know that they're gone or requested a letter of transfer to their new congregation.

I prefer to think that those who haven't been here since Pastor Eric left (and they're still angry at either him or the Church) ... or ... since Pastor Tom came ... or ... since Pastor Tom left ... or ... since the congregation entered into its mediation process ... or ... since Pastor Curt came (and hasn't left yet ... but the clock is ticking!) ... ***I prefer to think that each of them and that each of us is a glowing ember waiting to be fanned into flame for Jesus.***

One of the most basic means by which the Holy Scripture renews us is the

reading of the Bible. I'm delighted to know that over 60 individuals are participating in ***The Bible in 90 Days*** during these months of January, February, and March. I continue to hear stories from other congregations that have participated in this effort, and in every instance individuals talk about changed lives and pastors talk about renewed congregations. **May it be so among us, O Lord!** If you aren't already in such a program, may I encourage you to go to [www.youversion.com](http://www.youversion.com) and find a program that might fit your schedule.

Another of the basic means by which the Holy Spirit renews us is ***growth in our personal and congregational stewardship***. I am hoping that the congregation will approve the Church Council's recommendation to fund a Christian stewardship consultant who will work with us also during the first part of this year to grow in our personal and congregational stewardship commitments. I have had the privilege of working with two of these organizations several times during the past thirty years, and in each instance their ministry among the congregations I served brought renewed vitality and ministry. **May it be so among us, O Lord!**

A third basic means by which the Holy Spirit renews us is helping us come together with each other. Our basic coming together is always around the Word and Sacraments, what Martin Luther refers to as **“the Means of Grace.”** Nothing is more important to a healthy congregation than having its members gather regularly (Scripture says weekly) in worship. ***If you are in worship once a month or less, could I challenge you to double your worship attendance. Better yet, could I challenge you to make it weekly.*** If not here ... somewhere ... because the People of God gather on a daily basis throughout the world (even in cyberspace these days). **May it be so among us, O Lord!**

A fourth basic means by which the Holy Spirit renews us is by helping us get to know each other ... and I'm surprised by how many members don't know who the other members are. ***We need a new church directory*** ... and we need it yesterday! If you are willing to help, would you please call me at 847/609-5348 or email me at [cegerald@comcast.net](mailto:cegerald@comcast.net). Few things are more painful to do in congregational life than church directories and few things are more essential to and for congrega-

tional life than producing current membership directories.

I'm hoping you will join me in reading through the entire Bible during the first 90 days in 2011. Starting on January 1, 2011, we will read 12 pages from the Bible each day. We will start with Genesis 1:1 on January 1, 2011, and conclude with Revelation 22:21 on March 31, 2011.

For our convenience, the folks at **The Bible in 90 Days** have prepared a special Bible for us. It is the *New International Version* in easy-to-read print. The paper is thin, so the Bible is small and easy to carry. There are no footnotes, maps, or other resources in this Bible so you won't be distracted as you read. Copies of this Bible will be available in my office for \$15.00.

BUT, you don't need to buy this special Bible to participate in **The Bible in 90 Days**. You can read from whatever Bible you already have. (The "12 pages a day" is based on the Bible that I will have available in my office for you to purchase. This special edition has been set up so that every 12 pages equal one day's worth of reading.)

For those of you who live on the internet, you can go to [www.youversion.com](http://www.youversion.com)

and then find "reading plans" which includes **The Bible in 90 Days** ... you can select the translation or paraphrase you prefer ... and you can then read the day's readings right there on your computer screen, iPhone, or whatever hand held device you use.

During the series, there will also be weekly small groups you can attend. Please note if/when you sign up for a small group that we will be expecting you to attend that small group every week for 14 weeks. Each session is designed to last one hour, which includes small group discussion, a video presentation, and a brief introduction to the next week's reading. Each participant will receive a "participant's guide." I am asking every group, class, team, ministry, or organization in the Lutheran Church of the Master to adopt and to incorporate **The Bible in 90 Days** into your schedule during the first 90 days in 2011.

As the posters for **The Bible in 90 Days** says, this is an opportunity to do what 75 million other people dream about. On April 1, 2011, you can tell your friends that you just finished reading the entire Bible ... from cover to cover ... from Genesis 1:1 through Revelation 22:21 ... **NO FOOLING!**

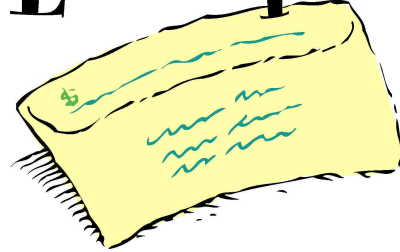

## From the DuPage County Treasurer's Office — Seniors Invited to Defer Property Taxes

Qualified senior citizens aged 65 years and older are invited to apply for the Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Program offered through the DuPage County Treasurer's office by the State of Illinois. This program allows qualified senior citizens to defer property tax payments until which time the property is sold. In other words, once you qualify each year for the program, you don't pay your real estate taxes until you sell the property or no longer own it. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues 6 percent simple interest until paid. To qualify, the senior citizen's household income cannot exceed \$50,000. Additionally, the property must be used exclusively for primary residential purposes.

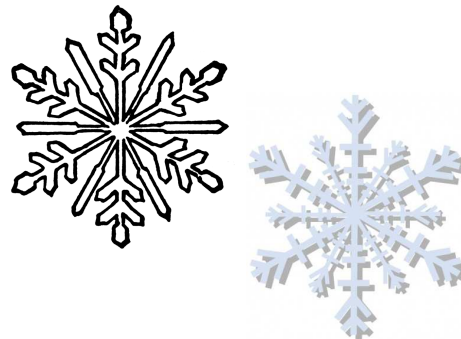
