Whole Life Discipleship Campaign To be Rolled Out in March

Friday, February 18, 2011

Good morning from St. Maarten –

It is 6:45AM here at the Oyster Bay Beach Resort on the Dutch side of the Island of St Maarten. The sun is reflecting off the Atlantic Ocean, the waves of which are pounding on the coral right outside of our sliding doors ... now and then, the splashing water comes right up to our door, leaving a salty stain. It is the perfect place to be reading the Psalms that talk about the roaring of the mighty ocean and the clapping of its waves (which is a way of saying to some of you, “yes, I’m caught up in my reading in the **Bible in 90 Days.**” I was five days behind when we landed ... now I’m two days ahead!)

(Reading the book on the pool deck has resulted in interesting conversations with those who pass by.)

On the flight from O’Hare to St Maarten, I read a little book entitled “**The Treasure Principle: Unlocking the Secret of Joyful Giving**” that Pat and I received from Dr. Robert Entner when we met with him a week ago to schedule our upcoming “**whole life discipleship campaign**” approved by the annual meeting of the congregation on January 30. I’m hopeful that when I get back home in ten days, I’ll be able to work with Mr. Entner in providing copies of this for every member of the congregation. It is little ... but it is **powerfull!** I

Sometimes I've heard people say that they don't think the Church should talk about money and possessions. Randy Alcorn, the author of this little book, reminds us that "15 percent of everything Christ said relates to this topic – more than his teachings of heaven and hell combined. (p. 9)" My experience has been that people have been brought to faith in Jesus Christ or renewed in their faith in Jesus Christ as they have become engaged in an intentional study of Biblical Stewardship in which the emphasis is on "**Equal Sacrifice, not Equal Gifts.**" That is what we will be doing at the Lutheran Church of the Master between now and the end of June. ***I'm excited about what God is about to do in our midst ... I hope you are too!***

Dr. Entner and I were high school classmates at Oldham High School (the graduating class of 1965.) His dad was the pastor of the Baptist Church in Oldham just two blocks north of the Lutheran Church where I was baptized and confirmed. We spent the usual hours that Baptists and Lutherans spend engaged in serious “discussion” about the amount of water required for baptism ... and at what age the water should be applied or entered. Since we graduated in 1965, our paths didn’t cross until a few years ago when Bob knocked on my office door at the Lutheran Church of the Ascension in Northfield ... and I now know that during those intervening years Bob served as a senior pastor for twenty years, and during that time he also served as an adjunct professor at Heritage University in Indianapolis, Indiana, and he trained pastors on several mission fields around the world.

We may have disagreed on the depth of water required for baptism ... but I believe we have never disagreed on the importance of stewardship in the life of each baptized member within the Body of Christ.

I believe the campaign we are about to participate in has the potential of being one of the prime events in the life of the

Lutheran Church of the Master. I am asking all members and friends of the congregation ... **and that includes YOU** ... to set aside two dates:

(1) Please plan to attend one of the three worship services on the weekend of March 19 and 20 and plan to attend the Orientation Rally on Sunday, March 20, at 11:15AM. (The Saturday service begins at 5:00PM ... the Sunday services begin at 8:30 and 10:00AM.) Dr. Entner will be preaching at those services and will be giving us an overview of the campaign during the Rally at 11:15 on Sunday.

(2) Please plan to attend a Celebration Event on Sunday, June 19 (details will be announced soon.)

In between these two events, please keep this campaign in your personal and family prayers. My prayer is that many of you will be ready and prepared to say “yes” when Bob and I ask you to become a part of the Campaign Cabinet. The Campaign Cabinet will consist of the Directors of the various teams that will be enlisted (Bob will teach us how to do this) and trained by Bob in numerous training sessions. No one will be asked to serve in more than one position in this campaign. Those whom we will personally be inviting to serve on

the Campaign Cabinet will be folks who will be willing to join with Pat and me in setting an example of significant and sacrificial giving and faithful service here in our congregation.

I am also praying that many more of you will be ready to respond by saying “yes” when one of those Directors asks you to serve on one of the Teams. I am also praying that you will give priority to schedule Bob Entner’s training sessions for the Team you might be asked to serve on.

During the first two weeks in May, members of the Ministry Team (yet to be chosen or trained) will go out into every home to ask for prayer, to share information about the campaign, and to ask for prayer concerns from those homes to be included in the **Prayer Vigil (May 20, 5:00PM through May 21, 5:00PM.)** This visit will be the only time that members of the congregation will receive such a visit ... and in this visit **they will be asked for prayer ... no one will receive a visit asking for money!** In a couple months, you will receive information on how to sign up to be a praying participant in the 24 hour prayer vigil which will conclude this part of the campaign.

A verse that I would encourage you to read and ponder on during this campaign is one that we just read in the **Bible in 90 Days** reading schedule.

Esther 4:14 – “*And who knows but that you have come to royal position **for such a time as this?***”

I have asked Merridee to mail and to email this edition of the **Master’s Voice** so that every member and friend of the congregation is aware of this campaign.

Simply Giving? Simply Easy! Simply Smart!

A recent Chicago Tribune article shared by Pastor Curt addressed the issue of electronic giving in mainstream churches across America and why people do and don't choose electronic donations. Some people feel that using automated giving "de-personalizes" their donation to the church. Others feel that it's awkward, even embarrassing, to have the collection basket pass them by without tossing in a tangible donation. Still others feel that electronic giving is reduced to the act of "paying a bill". All of these reasons are certainly valid, but here are some reasons why automated giving **is** important.

In your household, and mine, our monthly incomes are somewhat fixed, whether it comes from a salary or annuity or social security check. And a good portion of our expenses are fixed ...the mortgage or rent, car payment, phone bill, insurance premium, etc. And many of us hardly ever write out a paper check anymore, choosing to pay our bills online, whether by bank payment or by automatic debit from our accounts.

Our church also has fixed expenses -- unfortunately, it doesn't have a fixed income. The church never knows from week to week just how much revenue to expect. Yet, we look at the published budget vs. expenses and wonder why some weeks/months are in the "red" and others are in the "black". And we shake our heads asking "how come?" The answer is obvious:

Our church income fluctuates because our weekly giving fluctuates. Too often church gets our financial "leftovers", or perhaps nothing at all. And our irregular giving isn't always based on our personal finances....sometimes it's because we forgot our weekly envelope (*although there are pew envelopes you can use*) or we weren't in church that weekend. And when summer comes and our weekly attendance drops, then so does the church's income. When we go away on vacation, our own personal bills still have to be paid. So it is with the church.

When we choose not to give, or forget our envelope, or aren't in worship each week or are away on vacation, the church mortgage isn't reduced, the utility bills don't go away, the staff still works, the church still needs to be cleaned, the grass needs to be cut, and

so on. Our non-giving creates a negative financial impact on our church. And it isn't all about paying the bills – reduced income could result in reduced ministries – something none of us want to have happen.

One interesting point in that article was that the February 2009 snowstorm in Washington kept many of the Catholic churchgoers home. But it also meant they lost about \$10,000 per church that month, a total of about \$1.4 Million! I'm sure the ELCA and other mainstream churches have similar data. Can you even imagine what the impact this winter's snowstorms across the country will have on the churches?

More and more of us are using electronic banking, paying our personal bills online or by automatic debit. So why not include the church? Automated giving is a modern-day stewardship program that insures our church to have a more reliable and consistent monthly income. It's a win-win situation for both you and Lutheran Church of the Master.

I strongly encourage you to sign up for the "Simply Giving" automated contribution program. There are forms on the welcome table in fellowship hall. After

completing the authorization form drop it off in the church office for processing. You can designate weekly, semi-monthly, or monthly debit, in whatever amount you wish, and your contribution amount can be changed (hopefully increased!) at any time. Simply Giving is Simply Easy and Simply Smart.

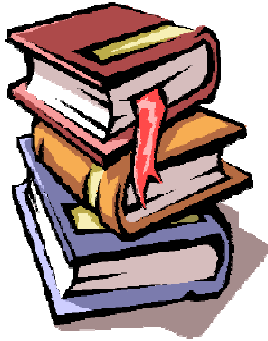
